Our teams came second in the Y5/6 Football, Sports Hall Athletics, Y2 and Y3 Football in Kingston. Our apprentice, being available to take additional coaching sessions throughout the school day eg: playtimes and lunchtimes, helped to improve our performance. • Having an additional adult available during PE lessons has enabled greater differentiation and enabled targeted support or further challenge for pupils. • Due to time given for cpd and team teaching with a mentor, the quality of PE lessons delivered at the school has improved and this is shown in our competitive results. • Having an apprentice who has been a young role model for participation, has been a positive influence towards the children's attitudes towards participation. 	<p>£6000</p>

	Upgrade of resources for other sports- purchase a variety of balls, bats, bibs, posts, cones, line marking equipment and training resources to improve the quality of provision.	The school has been able to upgrade resources for a variety of sports: we purchased a number of tag rugby belts, thermo plastic markings have been painted onto the playground and a line marker has been purchased to mark out pitches and tracks. Hockey, rounders and handball sets now provide us with a better range of equipment. The children have improved their performance and recently competed at Crystal Palace having won the area Tag Rugby competition.	£3,553
