The Sports Premium is allocated to schools to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport at primary school; it is also to be used to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Our assistant coach was available to take additional coaching sessions throughout the school day eg: playtimes and lunchtimes, this helped to improve our performance and ability to attend sporting events. • Having an additional adult available during PE lessons enabled greater differentiation and targeted support or further challenge for pupils. • Due to time given for cpd and team teaching with a mentor, the quality of PE lessons delivered at the school has improved and this is reflected in competitive results. • Having another member of staff raises the profile of PE, they have been a role model for positive attitudes towards participation in sport. 	<p>Enhanced provision for swimming form Year 3 -6 and differentiated intervention for children who need to reach the minimum standard for KS2</p>	<p>The school have been able to offer swimming lessons at Reed's School, Cobham to children in KS2 and the cost of transport and qualified instructors has been subsidised by the school in order to make these lessons accessible. Children have receive coaching personalised to their ability to enable accelerated progress where needed. This has enabled prior non-swimmers to develop confidence in the water and begin to swim, as well as enabling more able swimmers to improve their technique and stamina and also access water safety skills. 64% of the children who completed their swimming sessions last year are now able to swim 25 metres or more.</p>	<p>£900</p>
	<p>Participation in local school cluster and Local Authority sports Competitions</p>	<p>Paying for transport and staff cover enables a greater number of children to enter competitions. 	To train a member of school staff as a mini bus driver	School sports kit has been purchased for the children to wear at competitions and this helped increase pride in competing for the school and enhancing a team spirit. This has enabled children to be transported efficiently and safely to a wider variety of local events, including competitions in Kew and Thames Ditton, which have in the past been difficult to access.	£200
	To increase participation in after school clubs . To create links with a wider range of external sports clubs so that we can find sustainable ways of engaging pupils in physical activity including non-main stream sports.	Additional resources were purchased and a before school fitness club started for all children in KS2 eg rounders bats and balls, dodge balls, speed bounce mat, indoor sports tunnel, stopwatches, and gym tops. The new assistant coach has been given Netball training to set up a dedicated club to promote this sport within the school community. The team competed in the Borough Netball competition and were runners up for the Plate. Further links have been made through extra-curricular provision with some children attending outside of school. Providers have been encouraged to promote their clubs through school in a variety of ways eg Tae Kwonda and Yoga during Well-Being week.	£1,000

As part of this initiative we have been promoting healthy, active lifestyles and have had vegetable beds built to promote gardening and healthy eating. 	To purchase a trim trail, maintain a climbing wall and buy a Table Tennis table for the school	To encourage active and healthy lifestyles during lunch and playtime especially for older KS2 children, a table tennis table has been purchased and this had proved to be extremely popular with the KS2 children.
