

Home Learning - Water 30th April 2020




Hello Butterfly Class,

YouTube

This week on YouTube I will be reading one of my favourite stories 'Me..' by Emma Dodd. It is all about a baby Penguin who discovers the world for the first time.

Penguin Maths

Water Play

In a sink, bath, paddling pool etc. explore playing with jugs, cups, measuring spoons of lots of different sizes. Discuss together as children are playing which container has more and which has less etc. How many small cups does it take to fill up the big jug? Encouraging children to explore and express what they are doing as they play.

How many fish?

Penguins love to eat fish! Write 6 - 10 numbers up to number 20 in your child's book and tell them the penguin ate one more fish so how many did it eat. Ask them to write the answer next to your number.

Phonics

The three sounds of the week are:

w, or and er.

How many words can you think of that have the sounds in the beginning, middle or end of the word?

Can you write three words for each sound in your yellow book?

Choose one of the words and write a simple sentence: e.g. The worter is bloo.

The see is big.

(The spelling does not have to be correct but must be phonetically correct. The words must be written to match the sounds e.g. worter not water.

See not sea. Bloo not blue.

Science - Sinking and Floating


Make: Can you use empty yoghurt pots, boxes or any recycling you have at home to make your very own boat. I can't wait to see your different designs.



Predict: Once you have made your boat discuss together if you think your boat will sink or float and why. Record what you think will happen in your yellow book with the help of an adult.

Test: Test if your boat sinks or floats in the kitchen sink, bath, paddling pool etc.

Challenge: If your boat floats in the water I wonder how many plastic people / toys you could put on your boat before it starts to sink. Take a photo of your boat with all its passengers.



Objects: Find 5 - 10 objects in your house and predict if they are going to sink or float. Record in your yellow book the name of the object and what happened when you put it in the water. I can't wait to see the objects you experiment with.
