

# Year 3 Home Learning

**Date Set: Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November**



Dear Fox Class,

Welcome back! We hope you had an enjoyable and relaxing holiday. This week we have begun reading our new book: "Stone Age Boy", and have been exploring it through drama. In music, we began learning how to play the Glockenspiel, and played songs with the D and E notes. We have been learning how to add 3 digit numbers and 1 digit numbers when we have to exchange. We have learned a new method called the column method, which helps us exchange easily.

## Maths

In order to confidently add and subtract 3 digit numbers, children should be able to quickly recall number facts within 20. Practise this at home by asking your child quick recall questions such as  $5+4$ ,  $17-3$  and  $6+7$ . The more confidently your child can recall facts such as these, the easier they will find it to take on more complex challenges.

## Reading

Thank you for your support in reading this week. The children have been bringing their books in daily which has allowed us to read with them regularly, and them to change their books when needed. Continue to read for 15 minutes a night, and to ask comprehension questions from the reading dogs bookmark.

## Spelling:

Fantastic work on the spellings again this week! This week we are exploring words where the "ur" sound is made with the letters "or". This often happens when following the letter "w, such as "worm" or "work". It's also often used in professions such as "doctor", "author" and "sailor" and at the end of certain nouns like "anchor" and "razor".

## Times tables

I'm super impressed by how hard the children are working on their times tables, Well done! It is expected that by the end of year 2 children know their 2, 10 and 5 times tables and division facts fluently. Please practise these at home, as every Friday we will test times tables knowledge. Logins for TT Rockstars are stuck into the front of the reading record. Every child has been assigned the 2X table to start with. Focus on practising the division facts with your child as these are more challenging.
