Why does child safety matter?



44 All paediatricians dread breaking bad news: telling parents that their child requires emergency surgery or intensive care, or that resuscitation has been unsuccessful. When illness or death is the result of a preventable accident, the emotional toll is compounded by the avoidable nature of the tragedy.

For the poorest families

Children from the poorest families are 40% more likely to have a serious accident.

80% of accidents to under 5s happen at home. 1 child dies each week from an accident at home.




Serving our community
