



Adults in our school think it is very important that all the adults have the same expectations and that we are consistent in our approach. For this reason we have developed 3 rules that all adults will remind children of:

- 1. 'Ready' Ready is the right time, right place and the right attitude. Readiness for all things including being ready for learning, ready to listen, ready to go to lunch etc.
- 2. 'Respectful' Respectful is caring for ourselves, other people and our environment. When people are respectful, they are showing respect to their peers, to adults, to their environment, to themselves.
- 3. 'Safe' Safe is taking actions that look after myself and others. Being safe at school leads to everyone feeling safe in the learning environment, safe with the people around them and safe in the activities in which they are taking part in.

What happens when we follow rules?

When everyone works together in a community;

- We feel happy, safe and valued.
- We can all reach our shared goals.
- We can all be the best version of ourselves that we can be.
- We can all fulfil our potential.

Some people may say that it's in our nature to do good to others. After all, there has been a "random act of kindness" movement for a long time. But, in general, most people only help other people when:

- 1. It's their friend or family.
- 2. It's convenient for them.
- 3. They're in a good mood, or
- 4. They expect something in return.

But the Bible doesn't say do random acts of kindness when you're feeling good. It says to love others at all times. It even says love your enemies as well as those that persecute you. If you are kind only to your friends, how are you any different from anyone else.

Everybody does that (Matthew 5:47). Loving everyone at all times is a much tougher task to accomplish




