World Book Day is almost here!






Online safety

Our main priorities at St Mary's is to ensure that children are happy, safe and valued. During lessons and Collective Worship, we regularly speak to our pupils about how they can stay safe online. We would just like to remind you as families of some of the legal age requirements to the different social media platforms they might be accessing at home.

As a school, we do not recommend that any of our children are on these platforms or accessing a smartphone. If you (as parents and carers) decide to give them access, please make sure you are monitoring them regularly, putting on restrictions and having frequent conversations about following these SMART guidelines.

Visit to the Islamic Community Centre

Providing enriching opportunities for our children is an important part of making learning meaningful and memorable.

On Wednesday, Year 5 and 6 visited the Islamic Community Centre in Morden. It was an incredibly enjoyable and informative trip. Sh Bilal Patel, the Iman, spoke to the children about the five pillars of the Islamic faith and let the children spend time in their main hall where daily prayers take place. Refreshments were provided for the day and they allowed the children to use a special VR set to experience the pilgrimage to Mecca.



Collective Worship

We started Collective Worship this term by looking at the Julia Donaldson book, "Paper dolls". We thought about how we are all different, but special, made by God. We discussed the importance of working together and never losing what we love in our hearts. We have also been learning a wonderful song called, "Every Step". You can listen to it <u>here</u>.

Science Week

This year, the topic for British Science Week is "Change and Adapt". To celebrate and explore this, on the 10th March, we will be having workshops for Years 1–6. The children will look at topics ranging from understanding natural selection and evolution, to examining the physical principles behind changing states of matter. Children will engage with concepts such as heat transfer, air pressure, gravity and material properties. During the week we will



also be doing activities in classrooms related to this topic. See see a separate Weduc which includes an activity pack.
